ARE YOU A ...

Lambing Season has arrived, and we ask that care and attention is taken controlling your dog in and around areas with sheep as well as other farm animals.

Dogs by nature may want to play or chase livestock which may unwittingly cause harm.

Dog attacks on livestock are costing an estimated \pounds 1.6m a year.

Stay safe, use a lead around livestock. Cattle can be extremely inquisitive so if you feel threatened, release your dog so you can both get to safety separately.

Please be aware sheep worrying is an offence.

It is legal for landowners to shoot dogs to protect their livestock, providing there was no other way of stopping the dog worrying their animals and they report the killing to the police within 48 hours.

Livestock also includes domestic fowl, geese or ducks.

Wherever you are, clean up after your dog.

Did you know that dog poo can spread disease to farm animals? It's important to clean up after your dog wherever you are – just bag it and bin it.

Dear Cllr Maskell

There are still significant workforce issues currently disrupting many community pharmacies across the South West region and throughout the country, including in Braunton. I'm afraid this has not changed since our last communication in December. Pharmacies are not able to provide services when there is no pharmacist on site.

If a pharmacy closes temporarily at short notice, it is required to notify NHS England and NHS Improvement, as commissioner. At the time of writing, I note that the Lloyds in Braunton reported five closures in January and four in February. Although this represents a better performance than last autumn, it is clearly not acceptable, so we remain in touch with Lloyds at regional and national level to ensure that it meets its full contractual obligations.

Following our latest discussions, I am glad to say that the head of the Lloyds division for Braunton anticipates a further step up this week, when the branch manager – also the pharmacist – is expected back to work after an illness.

On your point about there being interested parties, you may remember I outlined previously the mechanism by which a person or company can apply to open a new pharmacy, and the regulations which define the process that applicants and NHS England and NHS Improvement must follow to determine the application. This means any person or company that is qualified to operate a community pharmacy can make an application at any time. To quality, a person must be a pharmacist, a partnership of pharmacists or a corporate body with a pharmacist appointed to the role of superintendent pharmacist.

He was disappointed with the response received and expressed his concerns that the proposal might not have been properly explained to the Planning department. | | |
| | | He clarified that the carriage would be parked on a railway track and would be movable. The carriage would be on wheels above ground level and unlikely to flood. It was also noted that this area did not flood in 2012. There is no mention regarding the heritage value to the community. The proposal with its links to the historic railway would enhance the site. | | |

Members were concerned that the proposal might result in creating a blind area between the carriage and river and that anti social behaviour might become an issue. Roger acknowledged this but felt that it would not create a blind spot bigger than the one that already exists between the Hub and river.

Members suggested that the Recreational Ground might be a better area for this project. The Mens Shed had considered using the Recreational Ground but it has no link to the historic railway. If this site were used the Mens Shed would use porta cabins similar to their proposal at the Depot. The Recreational Ground also suffers with anti social behaviour and it is likely that the Mens Shed would be a target for vandalism. The neighbouring residents would need to be consulted and might not support the project due noise disturbance.

Members fully supported the Mens Shed and requested the Clerk to approach stakeholders/consultees including the North Devon Council Landscape and Countryside Officer, Devon County Council Public Rights of Way and the Devon and Cornwall Constabulary regarding the Mens Shed proposal. The Clerk reminded members that the Council had been successful in securing Locality funding to produce a Master Plan for Braunton. The funding will commission professional planners at AECOM to redesign and make better use of land in the community. As the Council are in the early stages of producing the Master Plan it would be a good opportunity to include plans for the Mens Shed.

RESOLVED: That

- a. the Council supports the Mens Shed parking a railway carriage in the Caen Street overflow car park, subject to necessary permissions being granted.
- b. the Clerk to approach stakeholders as detailed above and report back to members prior to the meeting on the 15th March, when the Council will ratify and adopt its decision taken under delegated powers.

Tracey,

Good morning, sorry for the lack of response. Somewhat overtaken with storm damage response and compounded by annual leave for half term!

From the information provided it appears that the footprint of the development falls within what would normally considered to be 'root protection areas*' that would be considered the minimum area required to sustain existing tree growth. As such there is clearly a risk of losing the existing trees from within the footprint of the structure and as a result of harm to adjacent trees and I suspect there would be insufficient space to achieve any effective mitigation plating.

(* rule of thumb is that a root protection area RPA will be equivalent to a circle with a radius of 12x the diameter of the tree stem – i.e. a 500mm diameter tree should have no development within a minimum distance of 6 metres – but this should be modified where roots may be limited by hard surfacing or buildings – i.e. offsetting to achieve the same rooting area)

At this stage no information has been provided as to what works would need to be carried out in association with the proposal for example soil stripping/levelling, footings, service connections etc. so I am unable to comment with any degree of accuracy.

If consulted on a formal planning application I would expect the application to be supported by a detailed arboricultural impact assessment carried out by the applicant and used to inform site layout and design and which should demonstrate how existing trees have been taken into consideration. I would obviously raise an objection to any proposal that resulted in significant tree losses that could be avoided or which could not be effectively mitigated.

Hello Tracey

That sounds like an interesting idea! With the photos showing the four corners I assume, of the track section, it is tricky to tell how close the carriage will come to the cycleway edge, as the route curves here (top right photo on the second page you sent through illustrates). Given that the overall height of the carriage will be considerable, I wonder if the best approach would be to extend the section of fencing like that behind the police station along the verge by the cycleway, which will help delineate it and secure it. It would also provide something to attach to for any interpretation – having the carriage on the old railway route will definitely create lots of interest so would need some interpretation here.

Overall, I don't think we would have any objections per se, you are the landowners here, and the public footpath element Braunton FP78 would not be obstructed by that footprint. The only real issue I can foresee is during installation, when the cycleway / footpath would need to be closed off temporarily. If things do go ahead her, just let us know in advance and we can make any necessary temporary closure orders.

This is the link to the latest Pharmaceutical Needs Assessment (2018-2021) which was approved by the Board on the 8th March 2018 <u>Pharmaceutical Needs Assessment - Devon Health and</u> <u>Wellbeing</u>. Ordinarily this would have been updated last year but there was a national decision by the NHS that as a result of the pandemic, and its impact on public health staff resources, PNA refreshes can be delayed a year. An updated version will be published later in this year.

It is important to point out that while the Health and Wellbeing Board has a duty to provide information about pharmaceutical provision across Devon in the form of a Pharmaceutical Needs Assessment (updated every 3 years) the Board has no responsibility for pharmacy provision in Devon, neither for the closure of pharmacies nor the opening of new ones. The decision for pharmacy provision rests with NHSE/I who engage with a number of stakeholders, as well has having regard to the needs assessment to inform their ultimate decision on pharmacy provision.

Braunton Parish Council understands that you are the Chair of the Devon Health and Wellbeing Board at Devon County Council. The Council wrote to your predecessor, Councillor Leadbetter, in January 2020 regarding concerns with pharmacy provisions in Braunton. The issues at that time were due to the closure of the Lloyds Caen Street Pharmacy, please find copies of our emails below. Since 2020, the situation with pharmacy provisions in our community have become worse due to poor corporate management and a shortage of pharmacists. Responsibility for assessing whether the current provisions of pharmaceutical services is adequate to meet the needs of local people rests with the Devon Health and Wellbeing Board, which is hosted by Devon County Council. The last comprehensive Pharmaceutical Needs Assessment (PNA) was 2015-2018, by law, this should be carried out every three years and is now long overdue.

The Parish Council are aware of the immense pressures and workload that the local staffing team at the Caen Medical Centre Pharmacy have to cope with on a regular basis. Thank you for your update reported at our full Council meeting on Monday 13 January via County Councillor Caroline Chugg.

The Parish Council notes that in your letter dated 24 September 2019 the Devon Health and Wellbeing Board concluded that no current gap in pharmaceutical provision was identified following the closure of the Lloyds Pharmacy. Braunton Parish Council strongly disagrees with the Board's conclusion as it is evident from customers feedback and local councillors own observations, that since the closure of the Lloyds Pharmacy in Caen Street the remaining Lloyds Pharmacy in Braunton (adjacent to the Caen Medical Centre) has struggled to cope with the demand on the service, including:

- Customers are experiencing long waiting times to collect prescriptions some in excess of two hours.
- 2. There is insufficient space within the Pharmacy to cope with demand long queues encroach on to the adjacent car park.
- 3. The Pharmacy has lost its consultation service as the private consultation room is full of boxes.
- 4. Customers with mobility assistive devices or pushchairs are unable to access the Pharmacy due to insufficient space and high demand on the service.

- Staff are having to work 15 hours a day starting at 7 am and not finishing until 10 pm due to the demand on the service following the closure of the Lloyds branch in Caen Street.
- 6. As we approach the tourist season pressures on this pharmacy service will increase due to the influx of tourists to the area.

The Parish Council have expressed its concerns to Lloyds Pharmacy who have confirmed that their pharmacy in Braunton is struggling following the closure of the their branch in Caen Street and stated,

"We are aware of the impact this situation has had on our patients and customers and would like to assure we would never deliberately disappoint our customers. I do appreciate that the community of Braunton feels let down due to service received and can confirm that with the changes continuing to be made there will be an improvement in the coming weeks. Please rest assured that we are doing everything that we can to make this a better experience for both our patients and staff.

I understand that the main concerns are for the general public and also for the staff in branch, who are struggling since the closure of the branch in Caen Street. I have forwarded your feedback to the Regional Management Team, so they can have the visibility of the ongoing concerns."

The Council would request details regarding how the Devon Health and Wellbeing Board reached its conclusion that there would be no gap in pharmaceutical provision in Braunton following the closure of the Lloyds Pharmacy in Caen Street. It was noted in your letter dated 24 September that the Pharmaceutical Needs Assessment for Devon will be reviewed for 2021 to 2024, the Parish Council feel that this matter needs to be rectified before then as it is unacceptable for the Board to allow local residents and the staff at the Lloyds branch to continue to cope for a further 12 months with a service that is struggling to meet demand.

The Council looks forward to receiving your views on this matter and details regarding the survey carried out by the Board which concluded that there would be no gap in pharmaceutical provision following the closure of the Lloyds branch in Caen Street.

1. BACKGROUND

- 1.1. Parish and town council websites need to comply with many standards including the transparency code, General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR) and Web Content Accessibility Guidance 2.1 (WCAG 2.1)
- 1.2. The aim of WCAG 2.1 was introduced under the Public Sector Bodies (Website and Mobile Applications) (No.2) Accessibility Regulations 2018. The aim is to ensure that public sector websites and mobile apps are accessible to all users, especially those with disabilities.
- 1.3. The Council budgeted £2k in 2021/22 and a further £1k in 2022/23 towards the provision of a new website.
- 1.4. At the Council meeting held on 15th February it was agreed that members would suggest local website providers for consideration to provide the new Parish Council website.
- 2. COST IMPLICATIONS
- 2.1. The Council agreed to appoint a website provider hosted on a Wordpress platform.
- 2.2. No further companies have been suggested, with the removal of VisionICT as they do not use a Wordpress platform, the following two companies have been requested to quote:

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RESOLUTION BY EPC TO DCC TO NORMALISE THE 20MPH LIMIT THROUGHOUT THE VILLAGE

The Exminster community has clearly expressed in the past, and continues to express, its concerns about the impacts of speeding traffic on the residents of the village, particularly on vulnerable road-user activity (by children, the elderly, cyclists, mobility scooter users, parents with prams/buggies/etc, horse riders, and so on).

Exminster, particularly along Main Road through the centre of the village, is characterized by stretches of only single pavements on one side of the road. These often alternate at close intervals obliging pedestrians to cross the road to the pavement on the other side and there are no pedestrian crossings of any kind to enable them to do this safely. Exminster also has many stretches of lane, such as Days Pottles Lane, where there is no pavement at all where vehicles travelling at 30mph or more pose real dangers to pedestrians, cyclists, those on horseback or on mobility scooters.

The Royal Society for the Prevention of Accidents (RoSPA) states: A large number of evaluation studies have demonstrated a link between the introduction of 20mph zones and a subsequent reduction in casualties. The size of the reductions and the consistency of results over a wide number of areas are further evidence for this link... As well as road safety benefits, it is important to highlight the contribution that 20mph zones can have in encouraging more physical activity such as walking and cycling, by contributing towards a safer environment.

Exminster Parish Council has adopted an environmental policy and is implementing a number of measures to help mitigate the effects of climate change and support opportunities for improved health and wellbeing. A 20mph limit would be consistent with, and would underpin, these measures through, for example, significantly reduced vehicle carbon emissions throughout the village.

Exminster Parish Council does not believe there is any advantage to be gained from yet another trial in a town (Newton Abbot) whose characteristics bear little relation to those in Exminster. As stated above, there is already a substantial body of evidence in the public domain which demonstrates that the listed advantages are real.

Many residential areas in the vicinity of Exminster, such as Alphington, Exwick, Kenn, Starcross, etc, have extensive areas covered by 20 mph zones/limits, in many cases with no substantive traffic calming measures having been introduced. RoSPA states: *20mph limits without traffic calming also reduce traffic speed… Their lower cost means that wider areas can be covered.*

Therefore, in order to:

- Increase child and adult activity levels
- Promote healthy active travel options (walking and cycling)
- Address climate change challenges and opportunities
- Reduce accidents and casualties
- Reduce inequalities

- Lower vehicle emissions
- Reduce congestion
- Meet the wishes and expectations of the majority of residents

Exminster Parish Council resolves to request Devon County Council to normalize a 20mph limit/zone throughout all residential roads and areas in the village of Exminster with the utmost haste – the Council cannot understand why any public authority would stand in the way of practical and proven safety, environmental, health and wellbeing measures being implemented without further delay.
