



Braunton Neighbourhood Plan


Braunton Parish Council have made an application to North Devon Council to designate a neighbourhood area. This is the area within which a neighbourhood plan can be prepared for the Parish. The Localism Act 2011 introduces statutory Neighbourhood Planning England. It enables communities to draw up a Neighbourhood Plan for their area and is intended to give communities more of a say in the development of their local area.

A neighbourhood plan is a very powerful way of providing significant local influence over the

planning process and will be used to decide the future of the places where people live and work giving opportunities to:

- influence where new homes, shops and offices are built.
- have a say on what new buildings should look like.
- grant planning permission for the new buildings you want.

The boundary is that of the parish boundary. The reasons for this are set out in the application letter which you can see on our website. This also contains a map showing the location of the parish boundary.

Would you like to see any improvements made to footpaths around the parish? There are a staggering 70 miles of footpaths in Braunton Parish which are maintained by Devon County Council. However, the Parish Council has access to grants for specific projects, such as a new stile, on footpaths (excluding coastal paths) around the village. In order to gain access to these funds, we must submit an annual survey to Devon County Council. This relies on volunteers who walk the footpaths to monitor them and report on their condition.

Kids Get Creative to Clean Up Dog Waste

Braunton recently held a competition with the three primary schools which invited young artists to design a poster to encourage dog owners to clean up after their pets.

The Parish Council and Freehelp Braunton have worked in partnership to promote this competition aimed at the irresponsible few who do not bag and bin their dogs' mess.

Letting dogs foul without clearing it up also poses serious health risks, as parasites in dog mess can cause blindness. The council have in the past worked closely with the North Devon Council Dog Warden to provide dog bins in the parish but more needs to be done to tackle this issue.

Chair of Braunton Parish Council Councillor Derrick Spear says, "The vast majority of responsible dog owners across Braunton clean up after their pets, which we as a Council are very grateful for. It is hoped that working with local school children will help raise the profile of this issue. It is an excellent project involving the children and allows us to raise awareness of the dangers of dog fouling".

Local resident Desiree Young and member of FreeHelp Braunton says, "This is such an important issue that needs to be tackled as dog fouling can lead to

Toxocariasis in humans, which causes serious illness and even blindness. Therefore, it is clear that the reasons for controlling dog mess are valid, and as a community we hope to work together to lessen the risk it can pose".
