Traffic and Safety Issues on Exeter Road, Braunton

The Parish Council have been in discussions with Devon County Council's Highways team regarding traffic and safety issues on Exeter Road, including:

- Motorists speeding
- Inappropriate parking
- Inappropriate drop off / pick up points for schools
- Obstruction of the highway
- Traffic congestion

Following the unfortunate incident where a Lollipop Lady got knocked down by a vehicle in Exeter Road, from the 19th September 2016, the County are trialling moving the school crossing patrol site from the existing location of crossroads at Exeter Road / Barton Lane to the signalised puffin crossing approximately 30 metres south. Parents / carers and pupils are

being encouraged to only use the signalised crossing to cross Exeter Road. This trial will be under review by the County up until the autumn school term.

The Parish Council is pleased that County Council are taking steps to improve the crossing points in Exeter Road, making it safer for school children and their parents to cross. The Parish Council will continue to work closely with the County regarding improvements to their Civic Parking Enforcement, signage for school crossing points, traffic congestion and visibility at Barton Road / Exeter Road junction by requesting the County to install a yellow junction box and educating and encouraging motorists to reduce their speed.
