



Braunton Remembers

You may have noticed the many large poppies The Royal British Legion and members of the public have decorated around the memorial gardens, and businesses have displayed in their windows, to commemorate the 100 year anniversary of the signing of the Armistice agreement which ended the First World War on 11 November 1918.

Earlier this year Braunton began its commemoration when the Rotary Club of Braunton Caen asked the three primary schools and Braunton Academy to research the lives (and deaths) of the 71 men from the village who gave their lives during the First World War. Pupils were asked to produce a commemorative poster for each man. These were initially on display in a special tent at the village fair in the summer.

The schools' commemorative posters will again be included in a display on the weekend of **10/11 November** when the U3A will run a WW1 themed static display in the Parish Hall. On the evening of **Saturday 10 November at 7pm** in the Isaac Hall at Braunton Academy, there will be a Remembrance Concert lead by the Original Military Wives Choir,



Chivenor with a combined choir from the four schools and the U3A. The programme will include some short relevant readings and a playlet. Braunton Academy has been awarded ten "There but not There" silhouettes by the Armed Forces Covenant Fund Trust and these will be present at the concert along with the commemorative posters. Tickets are £10 (Child £5) available from John Wensleys Newsagent, Slees, Braunton Academy and Croyde Post Office.

On **Sunday 11 November** there will be a parade through the village to St Brannock's Church for the Remembrance Service (at which the posters and silhouettes will be present) after which 71 children will join the return March Past and then plant small wooden crosses bearing the names of the 71 dead in the village Memorial Gardens. The parade will convene at approximately 10 am in the Caen Street car park.
