Community Spaces Support Fund Raisers

There are some wonderful community spirited people who selflessly give up their time to put on events in the village for us all to enjoy and raise some much needed funds for local charities. With many cancelled plans in the past couple of years I think these events have been particularly appreciated this year.

The Braunton Village Fair on the Jubilee weekend raised a total profit of £4,300. This was split between the two charities (The Calvert Trust and Children's Hospice South West), and for other Rotary supported charities for future giving by The Rotary Clubs of Braunton and Braunton Caen.

Braunton Wheels raised a total of $\pounds 2,000$, split between The North Devon Forum for Autistic Spectrum Conditions and ADHD, and other Rotary supported charities for future giving by the Rotary Club of Braunton Caen.

What must not be forgotten however is that all charities are given free stalls at these events on the Recreation Ground to enable them to raise their own funds, often generating very good incomes.

The Parish Council supports these events each year by providing the

space, and use of its facilities free of charge.

Our shared community space outside the Countryside Centre has also enabled charities to put on pop up fund raising days. It has also helped local crafts people put on a vibrant market on Wednesdays and Saturdays. The funding from stall holders currently helps provide funds to the Countryside Centre.
